Islamic Beliefs and Practices

Students will be aware that Christianity is one of the diverse religious traditions and beliefs in Great Britain today. Students will discover this through an in-depth study of: Key beliefs, authority, worship and duties and festivals.

Theme E: Crime and Punishment

Students will study religious teaching, and religious, philosophical and ethical arguments, relating to corporal punishment, death penalty, forgiveness, and their impact and influence in the modern world.

Theme F: Human rights and social justice.

Students will study religious teaching, and religious, philosophical and ethical arguments, relating to the status of women in religion, the uses of wealth, the freedom of religious expression, and their impact and influence in the modern world

Theme B: Matters of life and death.

Students will study religious teaching, and religious, philosophical and ethical arguments, relating to abortion, euthanasia and animal experimentation, and their impact and influence in the modern world

Theme A: Relationships and families.

Students will study religious teaching, and religious, philosophical and ethical arguments, relating to contraception, sexual relationships before marriage and homosexual relationships, and their impact and influence in the modern world.
